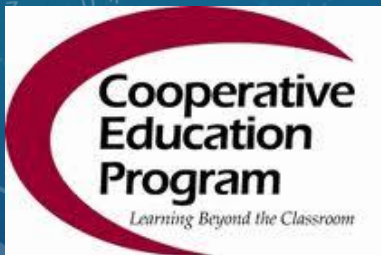

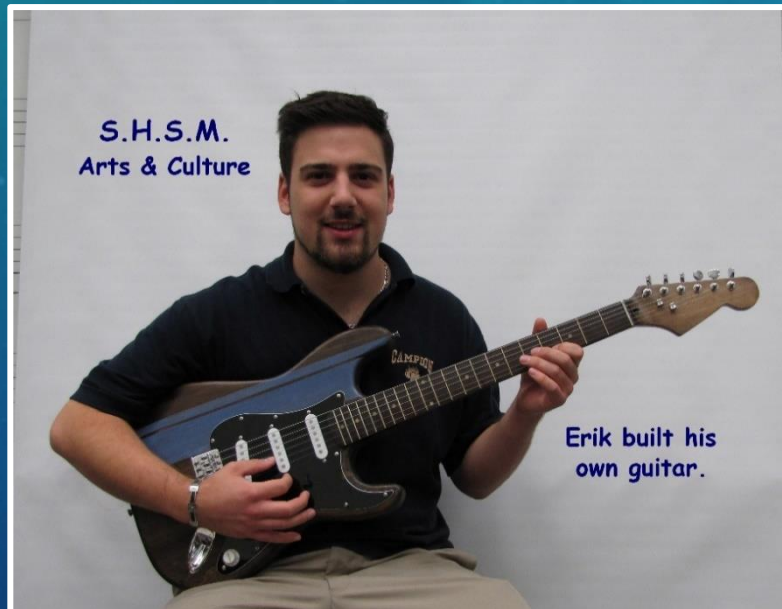

# ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA (OSSD)

## MINISTRY REQUIREMENTS

**\* Total of 30 course credits (110 hours per credit)**



**17** compulsory courses (includes the mandatory tech course - Gr. 9 or 10)

- 13 elective courses

\*2/30 of these credits must be an eLearning course – students can opt-out of this requirement with parent approval.

**\* 40 hrs. Community Involvement**

Begins the summer after Grade 8 – please refer to the Ministry of Education guidelines for what qualifies as community involvement

**\* Ontario Literacy Requirement**

Written Test in Grade 10 (OSSLT)

## Entering Grade 9 in **2024 or Later**

### 17 Compulsory Credits

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade) \*
- 3 credits in Mathematics (grade 9, grade 10, and 1 credit in either grade 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography (grade 9)
- 1 credit in Canadian History (grade 10)
- 1 credit in the Arts\*\*
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- 1 credit in Technological Education (grade 9 or 10)
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics and Citizenship
- 1 credit from the STEM-related course group

Seat priorities are as follows:



## Feeder School Students

- Seats are first reserved for our feeder school students and DP students who live in boundary and complete the registration process on time



## Regional AP Program Students

- The AP committee is used to select students based on their application to the program.



## Non-DP and Non-AP Students

- If seats remain, registration packages that are received via the “register for school” link used by Non-DP students. Remaining seats will be offered based on a first-come, first-serve basis. Parents will be notified in April if we have spots to accommodate your child.

# APPLICATION PROCESS

## FEEDER SCHOOL STUDENTS

- 1) Parents should have received the registration package from their child's Gr. 8 teacher. These were distributed to feeder schools when they visited Campion on Nov. 6.
- 2) All completed forms must be submitted at the "registration drop off night" on January 16. More details to come.
- 3) The \$45 Activity fee must be paid via SchoolCashOnline by the registration drop off night.

**\*A spot at Campion cannot be held if this information is not received.\***

## DP NON-FEEDER SCHOOL STUDENTS (and live in the Campion Boundary)

- 1) Please go to the Campion website to [request a registration package](#) be emailed to you.
- 2) All completed forms must be submitted at the "registration drop off night" on January 16. More details will be included in the email.
- 3) The \$45 Activity fee must be paid via SchoolCashOnline.

**\*A spot at Campion cannot be held if this information is not received.\***



# APPLICATION PROCESS AND IMPORTANT DATES

## *NON-DP students:*

- 1) Go to the DP website and click on Register for School (<https://www.dpcdsb.org/schools/register-for-school>). Follow the steps to create an account and register for secondary school.
- 2) Please note completing this registration process does NOT automatically mean admission to Campion.

Non-Dufferin Peel school applicants will be notified by the end of April of their registration status. The \$45 school activity fee will only be collected once we've confirmed that a seat is available to your child.

# SUBMITTING YOUR COURSE SELECTION

**DP Feeder school students** - submit Grade 9 course selections in the Registration Package (submitted on January 16) and via MyBlueprint (when you attend registration drop off night)

**DP Non-Feeder school students** and **Non-DP students** will be asked to submit course selections using the Registration package process. Guidance Counselors will manually enter these selections (they will not be entered via myBlueprint)
